

MARITIME AND PORT AUTHORITY OF SINGAPORE SHIPPING CIRCULAR NO. 11 OF 2022

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Applicable to: Shipowners, ship managers, operators and masters of Singapore registered ships.

PARTICIPATION IN THE WORLD METEOROLOGICAL ORGANIZATION (WMO) VOLUNTARY OBSERVING SHIPS (VOS) SCHEME

- 1. This circular informs the shipping community on the updates to the participation in the WMO Voluntary Observing Ships Scheme, to provide ship-based marine meteorological and oceanographic observations.
- 2. The ship-based meteorological reports¹ provide vital real-time feedback on ocean weather conditions to weather forecasters who use the data to improve the quality of the forecasts and warnings issued through, for example, the Global Maritime Distress and Safety System (GMDSS) for mariners at sea. The ship-based meteorological reports, therefore, form an important element in ensuring the safety of ships, their cargoes and crews.
- 3. The shipping community is encouraged to support the WMO/IOC marine meteorological and oceanographic observations and their National Meteorological Service (NMS), by offering ships to participate in the WMO/IOC Marine observations programmes.
