



BACKGROUND MEDIA BRIEFING FACTSHEET

About Singapore Maritime Week 2023

The Singapore Maritime Week (SMW) returns for its 17th edition from 24 to 28 April 2023. Organised by the Maritime and Port Authority of Singapore (MPA), SMW 2023 is set to be one of the biggest editions with close to 50 events and an expected 20,000 participants in attendance.

2. The theme this year, 'Ambition Meets Action', brings together the international maritime community to take collective action on achieving the goals of decarbonisation, innovation, talent, and services through thought leadership conferences, exhibitions and events held throughout the week. See Annex A for the full list of events; Annex B for speakers and panellists; and Annex C for the list of memorandums of understanding (MoUs) and agreements to be signed.

3. Singapore's Minister for Transport and Minister-in-charge of Trade Relations Mr S Iswaran will officiate the opening ceremony on 24 April 2023. Secretary-General of the International Maritime Organization (IMO), Mr Kitack Lim, will deliver the keynote address.

4. As part of the Opening Ceremony of SMW, Mr Chee Hong Tat, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Transport, and Ministers from Denmark, Norway, Portugal, and the United Kingdom, will participate in the SMW Maritime Dialogue on maritime issues such as talent, digitalisation, decarbonisation as well as partnerships between governments and industry. The session will be moderated by Ambassador Ong Keng Yong, Executive Deputy Chairman of the S. Rajaratnam School of International Studies

5. The Singapore Ministry of Transport and MPA will jointly organise the 2nd Maritime International Advisory Panel (IAP) meeting on 25 and 26 April, where global business leaders from the maritime industry and adjacent industries will discuss perspectives on key trends that will shape the maritime industry, and exchange ideas on how the maritime sector can seize opportunities in sustainability and digitalisation.

6. Six new members will join the IAP this year, including Mr Christopher Wiernicki, Chairman, President and Chief Executive Officer, American Bureau of Shipping, Mr Hiroaki Sakashita, President and Chief Executive Officer, ClassNK, Mr Yigal Unna, Chief Executive Officer, Cygun Ltd, Ms Merle Maigre, Programme Director of



Cybersecurity, e-Governance Academy, Prof Nigel Brandon, Dean, Faculty of Engineering, Imperial College London, and Dr Arun Majumdar, Dean, Stanford Doerr School of Sustainability. The new members are leaders and experts in their respective fields and will further enrich the IAP's discussions.

7. To play our part, measures will be taken to reduce waste and carbon emissions at SMW 2023. Air-conditioning at the venues will be maintained at around 25°C for energy savings and the use of single-use materials will be minimised. Marketing collaterals will also be published digitally.

SMW 2023 Events

Accelerating Maritime Decarbonisation to meet IMO 2050 goal which is expected to be enhanced

8. As part of the opening ceremony on 24 April, the **SMW Leaders' Perspectives** panel discussion will explore 'The Maritime Green Transition in the Current Global Economy'. The panel comprising international maritime leaders will discuss concrete actions to realise the ambitions of decarbonisation, identify green finance and growth opportunities, and explore ways the industry can rally together.

9. At the **13th International Chemical and Oil Pollution Conference and Exhibition** titled 'Spill Strategies in a Decarbonisation Era' on 26 April, speakers will discuss the role of future fuels in decarbonising global shipping, its safety standards, protocols, and mitigation strategies. The programme includes a table-top exercise organised by MPA, together with various government agencies and industry stakeholders, to test and demonstrate Singapore's readiness and capabilities in the event of a chemical spill incident. This is the first time that methanol will be simulated in the table-top exercise, which marks an important step towards preparing the Port of Singapore for the bunkering of new maritime fuels.

10. The **2nd Accelerating Decarbonisation** conference on 27 April will bring together prominent industry players, thought leaders, academics, researchers and stakeholders in the maritime industry to discuss developing international green policies and outline strategies and roadmaps, including developing economic and business models, making investments, and transitioning the workforce, to accelerate decarbonisation efforts for the maritime industry. MPA Chief Executive Mr Teo Eng Dih will deliver the opening address, and IMO Secretary-General Mr Kitack Lim is the keynote speaker. MPA and the MarineTech ecosystem have initiated studies to address the need for robust safety procedures and standards for ammonia bunkering



and operations. The conference will also include presentations by A*STAR Institute of High Performance Computing, the Global Centre for Maritime Decarbonisation, Maritime Energy & Sustainable Development Centre of Excellence from the Nanyang Technological University, and Vopak, on the findings at various stages of their ammonia bunkering study.

Digital Innovation and Maritime Services are Key Enablers for Maritime Transformation

11. Scheduled on 25 and 26 April of SMW 2023, the **MarineTech Conference** will showcase and discuss trending technology and innovation relating to smart port, smart shipping, decarbonisation, cybersecurity, and crew welfare. Mr Chee Hong Tat, Senior Minister of State, Ministry of Finance and Ministry of Transport, will launch the conference and deliver the opening address.

12. **Sea Asia 2023**, a flagship event held biennially in conjunction with SMW, returns for its 9th edition from 25 to 27 April. Organised by Informa Markets and the Singapore Maritime Foundation, over 300 exhibitors from 70 participating countries are expected to showcase their products and services. Mr Baey Yam Keng, Senior Parliamentary Secretary, Ministry of Sustainability and the Environment & Ministry of Transport will officiate the Sea Asia Exhibition Opening and tour the exhibition.

13. As part of the MarineTech Conference, MPA will be organising **site visits** on 26 April to PSA Innovation Centre, MPA's Maritime Drone Estate and Singapore Maritime Gallery, as well as the Singapore Polytechnic Centre of Excellence for Maritime Safety, for delegates to witness first-hand the innovations and technologies deployed in the maritime domain.

14. Maritime service providers are critical players that can determine the pace of industry transformation in digitalisation and decarbonisation. The **Maritime Services Leaders Forum** on 27 April brings together industry experts to explore ideas on what maritime service providers can do better to navigate the challenges and opportunities that will arise from the ongoing transformations of the maritime sector. Panellists include Mr Andrew Cutler, Chair of the International Group of P&I Clubs, Mr Frederic Boles, Chief Executive Officer, Lockton and Mr Dhruv Narain, Partner, A.P. Moller Capital.



Developing a Pipeline of Maritime Talent

15. The **3rd Maritime Manpower Forum** on 28 April with a theme 'Creating a Pathway towards a Future-ready Maritime Manpower', will explore emerging skills and future jobs within the maritime industry to prepare the workforce. Singapore's Senior Minister of State for Transport Mr Chee Hong Tat will deliver the opening address.

16. For the first time, a platform for youth-to-youth engagement is created at SMW to raise greater awareness of the maritime industry. The focus group discussion titled **Youth@SMW** will gather youths to share their aspirations and expectations of the future for the maritime industry. MPA Chief Executive Mr Teo Eng Dih will give an opening speech, and young maritime industry professionals, as well as Singapore's IMO Goodwill Maritime Ambassadors - Ms Akanksha Batura Pai, Head of Strategy and Growth of Sinoda Shipping and Mr Jonathan Choo, Partner of Allen & Gledhill LLP - will engage the youths on career opportunities in the vibrant and dynamic maritime sector.

Public Outreach Events to Raise Awareness of the Maritime Industry

17. As part of public outreach, MPA will be reaching out to schools and members of the public over the course of SMW 2023 to cultivate interest in Singapore's role and significance as a global maritime hub port and international maritime centre. Members of the public can be part of SMW by participating in any the following activities from 28 to 30 Apr 2023:

A) **Singapore Maritime Trails** - Participants embark on a journey through significant maritime landmarks in Singapore, such as Clifford Square, Fort Canning Park, Kampong Glam, Keppel Harbour, Singapore River, and Telok Ayer Basin.

B) **MPA Learning Journeys** at Integrated Simulation Centre (ISC), Port Operations Control Centre (POCC), and Sea Tour – For the first time, MPA is opening facilities to members of the public. The ISC tour allows participants to experience first-hand state-of-the-art technology employed for seafarers' trainings and shipping operations via sessions on the navigation bridges. The tour at MPA's POCC allows participants to gain insights into the complexity of managing navigation safety in a busy Singapore Strait. In addition, through the sea tours, participants will have the opportunity to witness container ships, oil tankers, car carriers, and harbour craft, navigating through the busy Singapore Strait, providing them a first-hand experience of life at sea.



C) Vessel Showcase and Singapore Maritime Gallery Tour - Participants will have the opportunity to go onboard MPA's new hybrid diesel-electric enhanced patrol craft, the 'MPA Guardian' and view the 'Combatant Craft Medium', operated by the Republic of Singapore Navy's Naval Diving Unit, up close at Marina South Pier. This will be followed by a guided tour in the refreshed Singapore Maritime Gallery.
