CONCESSIONS & SUBSIDIES



50% PORT DUES CONCESSION FOR PASSENGER-CARRYING VESSELS (EXCLUDING PLEASURE CRAFT FOR PRIVATE USE) (*EXTENDED*)

- From 1 Mar 2020 – 31 Dec 2021



50% PORT DUES CONCESSION FOR OFFSHORE VESSELS FOR DAY 91 TO 180 (*EXTENDED*)

- From 1 May 2020 – 31 Dec 2021

REGIONAL FERRY SERVICES



100% WAIVER OF PUBLIC LICENCE FEES FOR PASSENGER TERMINAL OPERATORS (*EXTENDED*)

- For FY 2019, FY 2020 and FY 2021



50% REBATES ON COUNTER RENTAL AND OVERNIGHT BERTHING FOR REGIONAL FERRY SERVICE OPERATORS (*EXTENDED*)

- 35% rebate for 1 Mar – 30 Apr 2020
- 50% rebate for 1 May 2020 – 31 Dec 2021



50% OFFICE RENTAL REBATE FOR REGIONAL FERRY SERVICE AND REGIONAL FERRY TERMINAL OPERATORS (*NEW*)

- From 1 Jul – 31 Dec 2021



\$3 MILLION RECOVERY GRANT FOR REGIONAL FERRY SERVICE AND REGIONAL FERRY TERMINAL OPERATORS (*NEW*)

- For qualifying projects that commence between 1 Jul – 31 Dec 2021

PREVENTION & DETECTION OF COVID-19 INFECTIONS



SUBSIDISED MANDATORY ANTIGEN RAPID TESTING FOR HIGH RISK MARITIME WORKERS (*NEW*)

- From 5 Jul - 30 Sep 2021



SEA-AIR VACCINATION EXERCISE (SAVE) FOR FRONTLINE PERSONNEL

- Frontline maritime personnel who work in high risk settings, including Singaporean seafarers and foreign seafarers on long term passes, can approach MPA for prioritised COVID-19 vaccination bookings.

MANPOWER & PRODUCTIVITY



MARITIME CLUSTER FUND – INTERNSHIP REIMBURSEMENT SCHEME (*EXTENDED*)

- For 1 May 2020 – 31 Dec 2021
- Co-fund 50% of internship allowance, capped at \$500 per intern, per month for up to 6 months
- For Singaporean and Singapore PR students from ITE, polytechnics and publicly funded autonomous local universities



ENHANCED MCF-MD (CERTIFIABLE COURSE) AND SELECTED MCF-MD (SHORT COURSES) (*EXTENDED*)

- For 1 May 2020 – 31 Dec 2021
- Co-funding percentage increased to up to 90%

CREDIT MANAGEMENT



EXTENSION OF CREDIT TERMS (*EXTENDED*)

- Between 1 May 2020 – 31 Dec 2021
- On request basis for eligible companies

FOR SEAFARERS



SINGAPOREAN SEAFARERS RELIEF PACKAGE (*EXTENDED*)

- MPA, Singapore Maritime Officers' Union (SMOU) and Singapore Organisation of Seamen (SOS) will provide financial support for eligible seafarers as follows:
 - Co-fund up to \$800 per month for eligible seafarers who are unable to secure shipboard employment between 1 May – 31 Dec 2020 (maximum support capped at 6 months in 2020)
 - Co-fund up to \$700 per month for eligible seafarers who are unable to secure shipboard employment between 1 Jan – 31 Dec 2021 (maximum support capped at 6 months in 2021)



INCENTIVE FOR SINGAPOREAN SHIP OFFICERS

- MPA, the Employment and Employability Institute (e2i), SMOU and the SOS will jointly provide up to \$10,000 to eligible Singapore issued Certificate of Competency Class 1 (CoC 1) holders who after obtaining CoC 1, can accumulate at least 6 months of sea experience as Chief Officers or Second Engineers from 1 Jan 2020 – 31 Dec 2021



ARRANGEMENTS FOR SINGAPORE MARITIME ACADEMY (SMA) CADETS

- To help SMA cadets to complete their diploma and obtain their Certificate of Competencies (CoC) with minimum disruption caused by the COVID19 pandemic.
- MPA and the SMA will exercise flexibility on curriculum requirements and put in place alternative arrangements such as carrying out classroom trainings online and deferring shipboard training as appropriate.
- MPA has also started to carry out oral examinations via video-conferencing for seafarer candidates.



RETURN OF SINGAPOREAN SEAFARERS

- MPA continues to facilitate the return of Singaporean seafarers who wish to sign off when their ships call at Singapore
- MPA is also working with SMA to facilitate the safe return of all SMA cadets



JOB-MATCHING FOR SINGAPOREAN SEAFARERS WITH SHIPPING COMPANIES

- For Singaporean seafarers unable to secure shipboard employment, MPA will work with SMOU, SOS and the Singapore Shipping Association (SSA) to match them with shipping companies
